### Program Registration Just Got Easier!

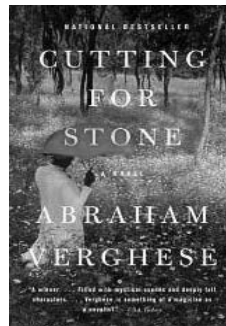
Anyone with a valid Emma Clark library card can now register online for most library programs. Those with email addresses on file will also receive automatic program reminders and registration confirmation.

For online self-registration, just follow these simple steps:

- \* Go to the Emma Clark homepage: [www.emmaclark.org](http://www.emmaclark.org)
- \* Click on the tiny calendar
- \* Find & select the program desired
- \* Select "More Info/Register"
- \* Enter your barcode (located on the back of your library card) and your last name
- \* Add or correct your personal information
- \* Be sure to include an email address if you want automatic program reminders
- \* Click "Complete Registration"

It's that easy! Of course library staff will be happy to register you as in the past, just have your library card ready. We will need your library barcode to process your registration.

### Adult Summer Reading Club: Novel Destinations



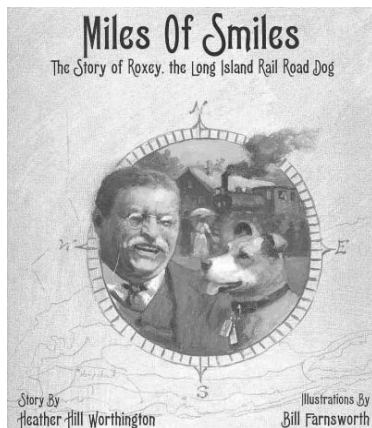

### LIRR's Celebrated Dog!

Heather Hill Worthington's Miles of Smiles: The Story of Roxey, the Long Island Rail Road Dog brings to life the true story of a celebrated dog who traveled on the Long Island Rail Road whenever he wanted.
