

 ★ Please have your child's Library card available. (Children of all ages may have their own Library card.)
- ★ Please give us a call if your child is unable to attend or is going to be late (so we can keep their spot).
- ★ After 5 minutes of the program start time, ALL open spots will be given to children on the "Standby List".
- ★ The "Standby List" will start 30 minutes prior to each class at the Children's Reference Desk. ★ If your child is "Wait Listed" for a program, this does not give them priority for the "Standby List".

Parents and caregivers must attend certain programs with their child. During those programs that don't require parent/caregiver supervision, the parent/caregiver must remain inside the Children's Library.





The PIXL Investigation on the Mars 2020 Rover Mission: Searching for Signs of Past Life on Mars


